We need suggestions on *shade of green* for the principal colour and a contrast colour-currently a rich earthy brown

And we need suggestions on a *nice simple font* – no curlicues. At the moment it's Helvetica. Also type size, use of bold etc. for headers and copy

We have used *the village sign* as a 'logo' - see right


We suggest **4-5 rotating pictures on the home page like Ilketshal St** Margarets

We need an obvious *menu bar* to click through to the individual sections – slide 4 shows relevant click through menus

Main content will be a *short description of the village* and *What's on* – the top one focusing on forthcoming events and then one with regular things to do.

We show the home page in one wide and one shorter column but are happy to look at options

Under the short village description, we might have a simple introduction to **other key information at a glance** 







# **St James is a traditional farming village and community in the heart of Suffolk**

A couple of short paragraphs about the village e.g. (fictitious!!) Dating back to Roman times, St James is famous for its church. St. Mary's Church is known for its ornately carved single hammerbeam roof which depict many different scenes, including court jesters, foxes, and many angels.
